Table Top Shakespeare - Coriolanus and Macbeth

Forced Entertainment (UK) and Ten Days on the Island



Ten Days on the Island (TDOTI) are pleased to present two of Shakespeare's tragedies, *Coriolanus* and *Macbeth* by one of Britain's most applauded contemporary performance makers, Forced Entertainment.

Forced Entertainment transforms Shakespeare's plays into captivating miniatures, played out on a one-metre tabletop with everyday objects. Imagine a salt and pepper pot as the king and queen, a ruler for the prince, a spoon for the servant, lighter fluid for the innkeeper, and a water bottle for the messenger.

These intimate performances explore the power of narrative and the possibilities of conjuring extraordinary scenes, images, and stories using language alone, creating worlds as vivid as they are strange.

Recommended for grades: 7-12

Patron advice: Teachers are advised to familiarise students with the plot of both plays before attending as both contain adult themes and violence.

Note: Each show must be booked separately on the booking form. The shows have been scheduled to encourage attendance to both with a short 45-minute lunch break in between.



Jekyll & Hyde

A Slightly Isolated Dog

Five hilarious performers deliver a delightfully twisted take on Robert Louis Stevenson's classic. In this reworked version of the gothic horror novella, expect thrilling comedy, shocking moments, and a whole lot of sass.

Following their hit *The Trojan War* at the Theatre Royal in 2024, New Zealand Theatre Company A Slightly Isolated Dog delivers the same highenergy fun and hilarity with *Jekyll & Hyde*.

Josie Alibrandi is in her final year of high school. Whip-smart and aspirational, she is a third-generation Italian teenager and scholarship kid, living with the shadow of a family curse and a strong penchant for rule-breaking. Juggling grades, boys, and the claustrophobia of an overbearing Nonna and saintly mother, Josie's life becomes tangled in the webs of class, identity, and family history as she finds her place in a changing world.

Iconic novel and cult movie, *Looking for Alibrandi* is the honest and empowered portrait of 1990s Mediterranean culture, that spoke for the first time about systemic racism in Australia from a migrant perspective. It defined a generation and to this day resonates with those caught in the stranglehold of identity and othering in this country.

Recommended for grades: 8-12

Patron advice: Recommended for ages 14+, smoke and haze effects, coarse language stage violence, suicide, sexual references, descriptions of domestic violence, discriminatory language.


INFLUENCER is a powerful exploration of social media's impact on our lives.

- Bookings will only be accepted by submitting the online booking form or by hard copy. Box Office will email you confirmation of your booking after it has been processed.
- To ensure that as many students and schools can attend as possible, bookings for groups larger than 50 in the Studio Theatre are not guaranteed and Box Office will be in touch to discuss your booking.
- Two weeks prior to the performance, Box Office will contact you to confirm the number of students and teachers/carers that will be attending.
- We will make every effort to accommodate additional students on the day, however this is not guaranteed.
- An invoice will be sent to your school for final payment within 14 days of the
 performance, based on actual numbers attending, allowing a variance of up to 10
 fewer students than the number confirmed two weeks prior. For example, if a school
 confirms 50 students attending and 55 attend, your school will be invoiced for 55
 students. However, if only 35 students attend, your school will be invoiced for 40
 students.
